It will be election night at the May meeting of CCAS. A list of the candidates and the office they will accept is enclosed.

Hugh Harber, Associate Professor of Astronomy and Science Education at West Chester University, will be speaking on "Advances in Teaching the Aerospace Sciences." His presentation is an overview of the aerospace topics that will become part of the science curriculum of the twenty-first century. They include such topics as planetary exploration, space stations, satellite communications and navigations, earth observing satellites, satellite telescopes and space planes.

As indicated by our survey, many CCAS members showed an interest in this area of astronomy. We are looking forward to Hugh's presentation.

All members are invited and may bring friends. Following the presentation, members may socialize over coffee. In addition, if sky conditions permit, we may use the observatory on top of Schmucker Science Center. Members must proceed as a group to the observatory where Ed Lurcott will operate the 12" 'scope.

APRIL CCAS MEETING

Mr. Al Nacman, an educator with many disciplines was our delightful speaker in April. He focused on Maria Mitchell's contributions, not only to astronomy in early America, but on her efforts to encourage women to pursue science as a career. He outlined some of her life's accomplishments, illustrating the Bell theory (everything has an effect on everything else). He related how through her work and her students' work, she greatly influenced the role of women in science in the nineteenth century. We thank Al for his enlightening presentation. Several groups joined us for our April observing session. A Cub Scout den, a camping Girl Scout troop and BVA members enjoyed seeing the night sky wonders. Thanks to the CCAS members who shared their 'scopes. It was a bit chilly, but a good time was had by all.

May's observing session on Friday the 5th (rain date Sat. 6th) will also be at the BVA at sunset. The first quarter moon will be dominating the western sky with Mars overhead. Jupiter rises later in the southeast. For the larger 'scopes, Pluto should be visible at magnitude 13.7 (the brightest it ever gets). Good finder charts appear in the May issue of Astronomy, the April issue of Sky & Telescope and the 1995 Observer's Handbook. A multitude of M objects are now high up in the evening sky.

All are invited. Those bringing 'scopes may drive up the farm road to the left of the parking lot. Members not owning 'scopes are encouraged to come and enjoy the views through the 'scopes. 'Scope owners are always pleased to have others look through them. Plus. binoculars will enable you to see many objects in the sky, bring a pair!

The BVA is allowing us to use their facilities and CCAS members are reminded that we should leave the area as clean as we found it. Your cooperation will' be appreciated. Even though it is Spring, the evenings still get chilly, so DRESS WARMLY! For further information call Ed Lurcott.




